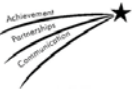

A Message From the Principal

Respect

During the months of March and April, we focus on the character trait of Respect at Fairlands and in our Pleasanton community. I came across the Family Respect Checklist, which is a great tool for discussing and encouraging respectful behavior at home. I hope you find it helpful:

Family Respect Checklist

- ✓ Do we show that we care about each other's feelings?
- ✓ Is everyone treated as equally important in the family?
- ✓ Do we listen to one another without interruption?
- ✓ Do we listen attentively to each other's stories and ideas? Or are they dismissed, laughed at, or criticized?
- ✓ Do we avoid put-downs in our family?
- ✓ Do we protect playmates at our house from teasing from others?

We are experiencing unprecedented budgetary struggles in our country, state, and district. Over the past few weeks we have heard from individuals who have expressed their heartfelt concern for our district and the programs that have produced highly successful student achievement. As various individuals and groups have addressed the board to share the impact of these programs on our students, it is unfathomable to think of cutting any of them! Our district has done an amazing job offering a well-rounded, academic program for all students, without a parcel tax. Unfortunately, with the current funding the state has projected it is not possible for us to maintain our current program.

As was pointed out at the board meeting on February 24th, "It is not the people in the room who need convincing. It is those who are not in the room." Many of those individuals have not set foot in a public school in years. They are not familiar with the standards and the accountability

we now have as a part of our educational system.

In the coming weeks, we as a community need to come together and respectfully talk to these individuals. We need to understand their concerns, work to clarify the facts and correct the misinformation. I invite our Fairlands Community to open the lines of communication while you are on the baseball fields, in the gym, at the grocery store or where ever you may be. The Pleasanton Weekly Blog is a prime example of individuals disregarding respectful conversation, questioning and interchange. I do not encourage people to participate in the banter that is taking place there. Instead, reach out and talk to your neighbor. Invite your children to share their current math, reading or science textbooks with neighbors. They may be amazed at what your children are learning and what they can do. Our students' intelligence, wit, humor, and academic abilities are phenomenal!

A Message From the Assistant Principal

It is hard to believe that the 2008-09 school year is nearly two-thirds of the way completed! March is when the days get longer and the flowers begin to bloom. It is also the time of year when Fairlands' students participate in some very important writing assessments. On Tuesday, March 3rd, 4th graders will take the California Standards Writing test. The make up test will be given the following day for any students who are absent. Since the Writing test is a secure document, please remind your child not to talk about the subject or contents until everyone has had the opportunity to take the test. We want to ensure that the testing conditions remain fair and standardized for all students who participate. The type of writing that students will do when they take the state writing test is called an "on-demand prompt".

It is important for all students to develop the ability to write to on-demand prompts. More and more, businesses, organizations, and educational institutions use on-demand prompts to evaluate the ability of individuals to express themselves clearly and logically, given a relatively short amount of time, using writing as the medium. The writing samples will be scored by readers at Educational Testing Service (ETS) and will appear on the STAR results forms that will be sent home in August. You will see the score for the Writing test under the "Writing Applications" section of the results.

The 4th grade students will not be the only ones taking an on-demand writing assessment during the week of March 2nd. All 2nd, 3rd, and 5th grade students will complete an on-demand writing



assessment as well. Students in 2nd and 3rd grades will be given "one day" to write and 5th graders will complete the writing in "one sitting". The writing assessments will then be scored by teachers using the "on-demand" rubrics that were developed at the district level earlier this year. Teachers will not score their own papers. Instead, they will work with other teachers to assess the student writing. The District writing assessment is a valuable part of our writing instruction. The on-demand assessments allow us to monitor progress, through the grades, that students are making in writing, especially in their ability to respond to an on-demand prompt.

Unfortunately, due to the budget situation this year, no results will be sent home to parents, and the score will not be entered on the report card as a district score. Instead, teachers have been asked to use the results of the writing assessment to help inform their writing instruction. The expectation is that teachers will use the results of the scoring to inform their plans for instruction in writing for the remainder of this school year. The main objective of the writing assessments will be to provide information that will help teachers better understand their students' areas of strength as well as their challenges in writing.

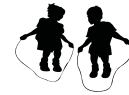

A Message from the PTA President

Dear Fairlands Parents,

By now you are all aware of the devastating budget cuts that will affect our children's education. Our Fairlands PTA Executive Board has been working hard to make sure our school community has current facts regarding this sobering situation. The PUSD School Board will be holding a **public hearing on Wednesday, March 4 at 4:30** regarding a possible parcel tax. The final decision will be made by the School Board on Thursday, March 5 at 6pm. If the Board votes in favor of putting a parcel tax on the ballot, they will also need to determine if the measure will be included on a May or June ballot. Unfortunately, no matter how the board votes on March 4th, the school district is required to distribute pink slips on March 13th to all teachers and staff who may be laid off at the end of the school year as a result of budget cuts.

Many people at our meetings or when they see me on campus have asked, "What can I do about the budget crisis. How can I help?" The best thing I can suggest is to talk to your friends and neighbors who don't have kids in school. Make them aware of the severity of the situation. Talk about how their home values are tied to the excellent scores our schools have achieved. For a parcel tax initiative to be successful, we need the support of our community members who don't have children in school. It has been said that 60% of the households in Pleasanton don't have school age children.

The other thing I strongly suggest is to log onto the **Committee to Save Pleasanton Schools** website, www.savepleasantonschools.org. The Committee to Save Pleasanton Schools has been formed with the goal of facilitating a successful parcel tax initiative to protect the quality of our children's education. On their website you can register your email, volunteer, donate, read the PUSD budget FAQs, and click on the link to register to vote or to check on your voter registration. If you aren't eligible to vote, you can still volunteer to help. For this initiative to be successful, we need to come together as a community. Please don't rely on someone else to take care of it. This issue is too important, and it isn't going to go away. We owe it to our children to fight for the quality of their education. There will be four members of the Committee to Save Pleasanton Schools at the **Family Fun Night on Friday, March 6th in the MPR** if you are interested in speaking with them regarding the PUSD budget crisis, volunteering to help, and donating funds to the effort.

At our next **PTA meeting on March, 24th**, we will be discussing and voting as a membership on whether the Fairlands PTA will donate funds to the Committee to Save Pleasanton Schools. As a PTA, an important part of our mission is the advocacy for quality education for all children in Pleasanton. This is a goal supported by the Committee to Save Pleasanton Schools.

After all this talk about the budget crisis, do you need to have fun? I've got just the event for you. The PTA will be having our annual **Family Fun Night on Friday, March 6th in the MPR**. It's a great time to hang out and relax, play some Bingo, and enjoy the wonderful school community that we have at Fairlands. Hope to see you there!

Latest Budget Facts

- At the February 24 meeting of the PUSD Board of Trustees, the Board identified potential program reductions and the personnel who might be affected by those reductions.
- For more information on these reductions go to <http://www.pleasanton.k12.ca.us/BoardofTrustees/Downloads/FullAgendas/fafeb2409.pdf>
- Reductions are identified to address the anticipated \$4 million deficit in the budget for the current schools year and an additional \$4.7 million deficit by the end of the 2009/10 year.
- Personnel identified in the reductions will receive a notice of possible layoff prior to March 15.
- The Board then has until May 15 to continue to analyze the budget and make final decisions as to program and personnel reductions. At that time, employees who are still affected would receive final layoff notices.
- **The number of employees affected by Tuesday night's decision include 188 certificated employees, 89 classified employees, and 18 administrators and managers. These include both full- and part-time positions.**

Important Meetings

- **Wednesday, March 4, 4:30 p.m**
- PUSD public hearing on possible parcel tax initiative
- Location: Amador Valley High School MPR
- No action will be taken on March 4.
- **Thursday, March 5, beginning at 6 p.m**
Additional Board meeting is scheduled at same location.
Board will take action on additional possible budget and personnel reductions and make a decision about a possible parcel tax initiative.
- Both meetings will be webcast live (not telecast), recorded and rebroadcast at a later date. These changes to the previously announced meeting schedule have occurred because the District was just notified by Alameda County of the possibility of consolidating an approved local initiative with the May 19 state-wide election.
- The county has changed the deadline for filing a parcel tax initiative to 5 p.m. on March 6. By the end of the second meeting, the PUSD Board will decide whether to call for a parcel tax initiative and, if doing so, for which election date-- either May 19 or June 2.

Dear Parents and Guardians of Pleasanton Unified School District Students:

From time to time, all of our schools have a need to use pesticides. Chronic ant, spider and yellow jacket infestations need to be dealt with quickly to ensure our sites remain safe for kids and staff. Weed abatement is necessary, not only to keep our sites attractive and preserve our investment in sports turf, but also to insure healthy, safe play areas.

“The Healthy Schools Act of 2000” requires *annual* notifications to parents, guardians and school district employees about the use of pesticides on their school sites. The Act requires all of the following:

The school district designee is to provide an annual list of all pesticide products that might be used on a school site. This product list includes over-the-counter pesticides available at retail outlets, but may not include certain products exempted by law.

Parents, guardians and school district employees will be afforded the opportunity to register with the school district to be notified of pesticide applications at their site 72 hours prior to application. (Emergency pesticide applications may prevent this 72-hour advance notification.)

The school district designee is to post warning signs at the site to receive pesticides 24 hours prior to application. Those warning signs are to remain in place for 72 hours after the application.

Pesticide application records will be maintained a minimum of 4 years and will be made available to the public upon request.

Provided for your use on the reverse of this notification is a listing of pesticide products that *might* be used at a school site during calendar year 2009. If you wish to be notified this year, prior to pesticide application(s), please notify your school by email or visit your school site office to sign up for this service.

The Pest Management Program and strategy utilized in the Pleasanton Unified School District focuses on using the least toxic, effective pesticides available. The District does not use nor authorize the use of Category I (highly toxic) pesticides. However, *all* pesticide that is used on school district property will be used lawfully, sparingly and judiciously to avoid risk to people, property and the environment.
